

# Backyard Birds SPECIALS

Special Edition Cards for Backyard Birds.

SET 1:



The Waxwing can be placed within the base set along with the other birds. The Waxwing has no color restrictions within the base set—it can flock with black, red, yellow or brown. It can also assist the flock in claiming territories.

The Titmouse can be placed within the base set along with the other birds. The Titmouse has an ability, when discarded, that allows you to claim an additional territory on that turn only. The discarded Titmouse's strength may not be used to help claim any of the territories.

SET 2:



The Great Horned Owl! The first multi-colored bird for Backyard Birds. Use this as either a black colored bird, in the base set, OR, if playing with the Raptors expansion, a purple bird. You can choose which color when you play it from your hand—you just can't change your mind after that, it must act like a black bird if you play it like one. The Lake House can be added with the base set and also used with the Seaside expansion.

### SET 3:



The Bee Hummingbird, the smallest bird in the world! Used in the base set, the hummingbird is used with other yellow birds to claim territories. Doing this allows you to double the total strength of the yellow birds used to claim the territory. The hummingbird itself has no strength, but using it with other yellow birds means you only need half the strength to claim the territory. **This can not work with any territory that requires a single bird to claim it.** The Flower Bed may be added to the base set.

### SET 4:



The Indigo Bunting has an ability to take any single brown bird territory, regardless of the strength needed. Any territory with (Parenthesis) signifies that a single bird, matching the exact strength, must claim it—the Bunting ignores the strength. Remember, the Indigo Bunting may only claim territories that brown birds can claim, such as the Secluded Silo, which can be added to the base set.
